

ASEB 2024, Accra, Ghana: Why Ghana?

Every journey has milestones that mark its growth, and the Africa Startup Ecosystem Builders Summit and Awards (ASEB) is no exception. When ASEB was launched in 2022 in Johannesburg, South Africa, it was more than an event—it was a bold declaration of intent. It was the beginning of a movement that aimed to unify and empower Africa's ecosystem builders. In Johannesburg, the Southern Africa region laid the foundation for a collaborative and inclusive approach to entrepreneurship. 

Being part of ASEB has been a privilege, and I look forward to continuing this journey of collaboration, innovation, and purpose."


